  and nursing assistants who:
  - A. Are employed in licensed nursing homes;

- B. Are enrolled in an approved certified nursing assistants' program which is consistent with the provisions of the department's rules governing the licensing and functioning of skilled nursing facilities and intermediate care facilities; and
- C. Have successfully completed the certified nursing assistants' program within 6 months following the date of employment.
- 2. Reimbursement of nursing assistants. Nursing homes shall be entitled to receive reimbursement under the department's principles of reimbursement for long-term care facilities for both certified nursing assistants and nursing assistants who meet the criteria set forth in subsection 1.
- 3. Training program expenses. Nursing homes shall be entitled to receive reimbursement under the department's principles of reimbursement for long-term care facilities for all reasonable expenses associated with carrying out a certified nursing assistant educational program consistent with the criteria of subsection 1.
- 4. Consistent policies. To the maximum extent practicable, the department and the State Board of Nursing shall adopt consistent rules with respect to the employment and training of certified nursing assistants and other nursing personnel who are employed by nursing homes.

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The intent of the bill is reflected in its title. July 1984, the Department of Human Services promulgated amendments to its regulations governing the licensing and functioning of skilled nursing facilities and intermediate care facilities which were intended to clarify certain issues associated with the employment of nursing assistants and certified nursing assistants in nursing homes. In general, these regulations were intended to authorize homes to employ individuals in certified nursing assistants slots so long as these individuals successfully completed an approved certified nursing assistants course within 6 months of the date of employ-Since that time, there has been some confusion ment. regarding the manner in which these individuals will be counted toward the staffing patterns required in the department's regulations. This bill clarifies that these individuals shall be counted toward the staffing patterns and that the department is required to reimburse nursing homes for such personnel.

This bill also clarifies reimbursement for certified nursing assistants educational programs. Generally, these are administered by individual nursing homes throughout the State subject to the approval of the department and the State Board of Nursing. This bill requires the department to reimburse homes for the reasonable costs associated with these programs and requires that the board and the department enact consistent policies with respect to these programs and related issues.

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
