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STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to create a Partnership Program for Technological Development and Innovation. Based on the recommendation of Technology Strategy for Maine Report, the Legislature appropriated \$50,000 to the Maine Science and Technology Board to award grants to conduct technology innovation projects. Six studies have been completed in the areas of biotechnology, food products and processing, computer systems application to production and manufacturing processes, fisheries, hazardous waste management and application of university engineering resources to businesses. This bill seeks to continue the Legislature's commitment to fostering technology innovation in Maine's businesses and dustries through public and private partnerships by funding the implementation of 2 or more programs.

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
