26	§2731. Purpose			
27 28 29 30 31 32 33	The Legislature finds that operator inexperience is responsible, to a great extent, for many motorcy- cle accidents and fatalities in the State. Despite the requirement that new operators wear helmets, the number of accidents and fatalities has increased con- tinuously over the past several years. Since the mo- torcycle riding season is short and confined primari-			

1	ly to daytime riding in good weather, first-time

9	§2732. Definitions
10	As used in this chapter, unless the context oth-
11	erwise indicates, the following terms have the fol-
12	lowing meanings.
13	1. Account. "Account" means the Motorcycle Op-
14 15	erator Safety Education Account of the General High-
12	way Budget.
16 17	2. Bureau. "Bureau" means the Maine Highway Safety Committee.
18	3. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the Com-
19	missioner of Public Safety.
20	4. Department. "Department" means the Depart-

22	5. Program. "Program" means the Motorcycle Op-
23	erator Safety Education Program.

32	There is established the Motorcycle Operator
33	Safety Education Program which shall be located with-
34	in the Maine Highway Safety Committee. The program
35	shall be under the jurisdiction of the director of
36	the bureau. The program shall include the motorcycle

1 rider course developed by the Motorcycle Safety Foun-2 dation.

3 §2734. Program coordinator; powers and duties

4 The commissioner may appoint a program coordina-5 tor to implement the program throughout the State. 6 The program coordinator, with the approval of the di-7 rector of the bureau, shall:

8 <u>1. Establish course sites. Establish sites of</u> 9 program instruction throughout the State. These 10 sites may include schools, public buildings and any 11 other facility that is deemed necessary for the con-12 venience of the public;

13 2. Recruit instructors. Recruit instructors to 14 be certified in the instruction of the motorcycle 15 rider course and who shall be certified by the Motor-16 cycle Safety Foundation as training specialists;

17 <u>3. Monitor and evaluate courses. Monitor and</u> 18 <u>evaluate the courses offered under the program. The</u> 19 <u>program coordinator shall report his findings, twice</u> 20 <u>annually, to the director of the bureau and to the</u> 21 <u>commissioner;</u>

4. Propose changes in and additions to the
 courses. Propose changes in the courses of instruc tion or additions and deletions deemed necessary for
 the purpose of this chapter;

5. Monitor and evaluate training specialists.
 Monitor and evaluate the training specialists and
 propose any changes in instruction deemed necessary
 to achieve the purpose of this chapter;

30 6. Promote the program. Promote the program and
 31 educate the general public with respect to the safe
 32 operation of motorcycles;

33	7. Monitor motor vehicle accident reports. Mon-	
34	itor motor vehicle accident reports and maintain sta-	
35	tistics of motor vehicle accidents, including acci-	
36	dents incurred by newly licensed operators; and

7	§2735. Supervision of endorsement and support					
8	The commissioner may suspend the department's en-

12	1. Fraud. The practice of fraud or deceit in					
13	obtaining certification as a training specialist;					
14	2. Misconduct. Any gross negligence, incompe-					
15	tency or misconduct in the instruction of motorcycle					
16	operator safety; or					
17	3. Criminal conviction. The training specialist					
18	is convicted of a Class A, Class B or Class C crime

28 Sec. 7. Effective date. Sections 3 and 5 of this 29 Act shall take effect January 1, 1988.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to reduce the number of motorcycle accidents and fatalities, a significant proportion of which are the result of inexperience. Despite recent helmet requirements and other measures, the number of motorcycle accidents has increased by roughly 11% in the past 4 years.

8 This bill establishes a mandatory Motorcycle Op-9 erator Safety Education Program for all first-time 10 operators of motorcycles. Any other interested per-11 son may participate in the program.

12 The program is the same comprehensive program de-13 veloped by the Motorcycle Safety Foundation which al-14 so trains instructors for the program.

15 The program is administered through the Depart-16 ment of Public Safety by the Maine Highway Safety 17 Committee. The commissioner may appoint a program 18 coordinator who will establish course sites for in-19 struction, secure instructors to be trained by the 20 Motorcycle Safety Foundation and monitor the program.

21 User fees will be charged to defray the costs of 22 hiring instructors, furnishing books and materials and the use of public facilities in which the program 23 24 is offered. A one dollar increase in the motorcycle registration fee and the motorcycle learner's permit 25 26 fee will pay for the costs of an additional person in 27 the Department of Public Safety to coordinate the program, as well as the costs of travel and promotion 28 29 of the program.

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
