15 16 17	IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SIX
18 19 20	AN ACT to Amend the Protection from Abuse Law.
21 22 23	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
24 25 26	Whereas, a provision of the protection from abuse law, amended to protect children, was inadvertently omitted from the amendment; and
27 28 29	Whereas, without this provision being amended the protection from abuse law does not clearly extend its protection to children; and
30 31 32	Whereas, it is important that children receive the immediate protection available through the courts under the protection from abuse law; and
33 34	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of

- the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
- 5 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 6 follows:
- 7 19 MRSA §762, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1979, c. 8 677, §4, is further amended to read:
- 9 1. Abuse. "Abuse" means the occurrence of the 10 following acts between family or household members or 11 by a family or household member upon a minor child of 12 a family or household member:
- 13 A. Attempting to cause or causing bodily injury 14 or offensive physical contact; or
- B. Attempting to place or placing another infear of imminent bodily injury.

17 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited 18 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when ap-19 proved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Public Law 1985, chapter 495, amended the protec-2 3 tion from abuse law to permit the court to issue or-4 ders enjoining a family or household member, defined 5 as an adult family or household member, from abusing 6 or threatening to abuse a child of the relevant family or household. Prior to 1985, the protection from 7 8 abuse law pertained to abuse between adults only. In providing protection for children under this law, Public Law 1985, chapter 495, inadvertently neglected to amend the definition of "abuse" contained in the 9 10 11 law so that "abuse" refers to abuse by adults upon children, as well as between adults. This bill 12 13 amends the definition of "abuse" to clarify that Pub-14 lic Law 1985, chapter 495, extends the reach of the protection from abuse law to children. 15 16
