

1 L.D. 1872 (Filing No. H- 501) 2 3 STATE OF MAINE 4 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 5 112TH LEGISLATURE 6 SECOND REGULAR SESSION COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "B" 7 H.P. 1335, L.D. to 1872, Bill, "AN ACT to Change Martin Luther King Day 8 from a Special Observance Day to a State Holiday." 9 10 Amend the bill by striking out all of the Title 11 and inserting in its place the following: 12 'AN ACT to Designate Human Rights Day.' 13 Further amend the bill by striking out all of the 14 emergency preamble. 15 Further amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated "§1051." in the first paragraph in the 3rd 16 line (page 2, line 14 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "Martin Luther King" and inserting in its 17 18 19 place the following: 'Human Rights' 20 Further amend the bill in section 3 in subsection 1 in the 4th and 5th lines (page 2, lines 38 and 39 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "<u>Martin</u> <u>Luther King</u>" and inserting in its place the follow-21 22 23 ing: 'Human Rights' 24 25 Further amend the bill by inserting after section 26 3 the following: 27 'Sec. 4. 17 MRSA §3204, first ¶, as amended by -28 PL 1985, c. 509, is further amended to read: 29 No person, firm or corporation may, on the Lord's 30 Day; Human Rights Day, the 3rd Monday in January; ex-31 cept between the hours of noon and 5:00 p.m. on those 32 Sundays falling between Thanksgiving Day and Christ-33 mas Day; Memorial Day, the last Monday in May, but if the Federal Government designates May 30th as the date for observance of Memorial Day, the 30th of May; 34 35

July 4th; Labor Day, the first Monday of September;
 Veterans' Day, November 11th; Christmas Day and
 Thanksgiving Day as proclaimed by the Governor, keep
 open a place of business to the public, except for
 works of necessity, emergency or charity.'

Further amend the bill in section 6 in paragraph
I in the first line (page 3, line 26 in L.D.) by
striking out the following: "Martin Luther King" and
inserting in its place the following: 'Human Rights'

10 Further amend the bill by renumbering the sec-11 tions to read consecutively.

12 Further amend the bill by striking out all of the 13 emergency clause and inserting in its place the fol-14 lowing:

'FISCAL NOTE

Enactment of this amendment will result in 16 increased costs to the various operating funds of the 17 State due to the "holiday pay" that will be received by certain state employees working on Human Rights 18 19 Day, for example, institutional workers, guards, etc. The impact to the General Fund will be approximately 20 21 \$120,000 to \$150,000, although the actual amount of money that will have to be appropriated in the future 22 23 24 will vary, based on each department's ability to ab-25 sorb the additional holiday pay for their employees.

26 There is an indirect cost, loss of productivity, 27 resulting from all other state employees receiving an 28 additional holiday.'

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " β " to H.P. 1335, L.D. 1872

STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This amendment establishes "Human Rights Day" as 3 a state holiday. Since Reverand Martin Luther King, Jr. helped poor people, women and handicapped people, 4 5 as well as Blacks throughout the world, it is more 6 fitting to memorialize and honor human rights. The Reverand Martin Luther King, Jr. would be honored as one of several leaders in the human rights movement 7 8 9 to include Medgar Evans, Mahatma Ghandi, Bishop 10 Luter, Nelson Mandella and others.

11 This amendment makes the holiday consistent with 12 other state holidays which are not titled after any 13 individuals and which are not celebrated in honor of 14 any individuals, except for Christmas.
