21 22 23	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
24 25 26	Whereas, present law will produce a minimum of \$15,000 more than is needed to regulate mobile home parks; and
27 28	Whereas, annual mobile home park licenses must be renewed on April 1, 1986; and
29 30	Whereas, renewal notices must by law be sent at least 30 days prior to that date; and
31 32 33 34	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-

1 2	vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
3 4	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
5 6	10 MRSA §9083, first ¶, as repealed and replaced by PL 1985, c. 389, §7, is amended to read:
7 8 9 10 11 12 13	The board shall establish a fee for a license to operate a mobile home park within the meaning of this subchapter. The fee shall may be no more than \$5 per mobile home site, but the total fee may not exceed \$500 per mobile home park. This fee must accompany each application for license, including applications for mobile home park expansion and renewal of license.
15 16 17	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
18	STATEMENT OF FACT
19 20 21 22	Current law, which sets annual mobile home park license fees at \$5 per site, with a maximum of \$500, will produce \$15,000 or more than is needed to regulate parks.

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
