18 AN ACT to Decrease Mobile Home Park License

21 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-
22 lature do not become effective until 90 days after
23 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

24 Whereas, present law will produce a minimum of
25 \$15,000 more than is needed to regulate mobile home
26 parks; and

27 Whereas, annual mobile home park licenses must be
28 renewed on April 1, 1986; and

29 Whereas, renewal notices must by law be sent at
30 least 30 days prior to that date; and

31 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,
32 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of
33 the Constitution of Maine and require the following
34 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-

1 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
2 therefore,

3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
4 follows:

5 10 MRSA §9083, first ¶, as repealed and replaced
6 by PL 1985, c. 389, §7, is amended to read:

7 The board shall establish a fee for a license to
8 operate a mobile home park within the meaning of this
9 subchapter. The fee ~~shall~~ may be no more than \$5 per
10 mobile home site, but the total fee may not exceed
11 \$500 per mobile home park. This fee must accompany
12 each application for license, including applications
13 for mobile home park expansion and renewal of li-
14 cense.

15 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited
16 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when ap-
17 proved.

18 STATEMENT OF FACT

19 Current law, which sets annual mobile home park
20 license fees at \$5 per site, with a maximum of \$500,
21 will produce \$15,000 or more than is needed to regu-
22 late parks.

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
