STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill establishes seasons for musselling.
Over the last 10 years, a rapidly growing market for
mussels has developed in this State. This has re-
sulted in substantial economic benefit to the State
through the harvesting of wild mussels and mussel
aquaculture. There is growing concern that, without
active management, the mussel resource outside of
aquacultural leases may be seriously depleted. Since
traditional harvesters rely on this resource for
their livelihood and aquaculturalists rely on it as a
source of seed stock, depletion of the resource will
have serious implications for the new industry.
