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- 1. Members. The committee shall consist of 7 members as follows: One member of the Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate; one member of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; one member representing the private sector with experience personnel recruitment and retention; 3 members representing community-based facilities for persons with mental retardation to be appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of House of Representatives; and one member representing the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retarda-Members shall receive no compensation, but be reimbursed for travel and expenses incurred shall in the performance of their duties.
  - 2. Duties. The committee shall review the stability of the work force in community-based facilities for persons with mental retardation, including issues of staff turnover, minimum orientation, training and educational requirements, wage parity with state-run facilities and administrative cost of recruitment, training and retention.
- 3. Report. The committee shall submit its report, together with any recommendations and legislation in final draft form, to the First Regular Session of the 113th Legislature.

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## 11 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill addresses a serious problem of staff retention in group homes serving persons with mental retardation. Community facilities have no system of education, training or career mobility for staff, causing severe turnover, burn-out and other personnel problems. This bill establishes an Advisory Committee on Staff Retention to study this problem and make recommendations. It also provides funds for a one-time adjustment in the salary of these workers to keep the gap between their wages and those state workers performing similar jobs from growing any larger, pending the committee's recommendations. This will keep the problem from growing worse.

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
