22 23 24	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
25 26 27	Whereas, there are 2 reporting dates established by law that cannot be complied with without an extension; and
28 29 30	Whereas, it is appropriate for the Legislative Council to grant extension in the case of studies; and
31 32 33 34	Whereas, this legislation is vitally necessary to permit the Legislative Council to grant extensions in the following cases without the need to change the law; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §2-A, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1983, c. 853, Pt. D, §1, is further amended to read:
- Duties of commission. Not later than May 1st 11 12 every odd-numbered year and January 15th of every of 13 even-numbered year, unless extended by the Legislative Council, the commission shall submit to the 14 15 begislature Legislative Council an interim report of 16 the commission and not later than November 15th of 17 every even-numbered year, a final report of the com-18 mission. The reports shall contain: A description of 19 the commission's activities; the recommendations of 20 the commission; the reasons for its recommendations; 21 drafts of any legislation required to implement its 22 recommendations; and any other material that commis-23 sion members may wish to submit.
- Prior to reporting as required in this subsection, and subsequent to giving public notice, the commission shall hold a public hearing on the report. Subsequent to reporting, the commission shall meet, if requested, with the Governor, the Legislative Council and legislative committees to discuss the report.
  - The report shall contain recommendations for: All compensation of the Governor, justices and judges, constitutional officers, Legislators, Clerk and Assistant Clerk of the House of Representatives, Secretary and Assistant Secretary of the Senate and representatives of Indian tribes, including, but not limited to, all payments for salaries, meals, housing, travel, mileage, constituent services and all other expenses and allowances, including additional payments made for additional services by any justice, judge, constitutional officer, President of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives and mem-
