STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill allows high school graduations to be set by local school authorities up to 7 academic days before the regularly scheduled end of the school year as established by the local school administrative unit. This bill gives some flexibility to local school administrative units which have suffered changes in graduation dates because of unforeseen "snow days."
