19 Establish a Date Certain for High
20 School Graduation up to 7 Academic
21 Days Prior to the Conclusion of the

24 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
25 follows:

26 20-A MRSA §4801, sub-§1, ¶C is enacted to read:

27 C. Notwithstanding this subsection, a local
28 school administrative unit may provide that sec-
29 ondary school students may be graduated up to 7
30 academic days before the regular end of the
31 school year as established by that administrative
32 unit.

STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This bill allows high school graduations to be
3 set by local school authorities up to 7 academic days
4 before the regularly scheduled end of the school year
5 as established by the local school administrative
6 unit. This bill gives some flexibility to local
7 school administrative units which have suffered
8 changes in graduation dates because of unforeseen
9 "snow days."
