- 18 LOTTERY
- 19 §371. Definitions
- As used in this chapter, unless the context indicates otherwise, the following terms have the following meanings.
- 23 <u>l. Bureau. "Bureau" means the State Lottery Bu-</u> 24 reau.
- 25 <u>2. Commission. "Commission" means the State</u> 26 Lottery Commission.
- 27 <u>3.Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the Commis-</u> 28 sioner of Finance and Administration.
- 29 <u>4. Director. "Director" means the Director of</u> 30 State Lotteries.

- "Person" means an individual, asso-1 5. Person. 2 ciation, corporation, club, trust, estate, society, company, receiver, trustee, assignee, referee or other person acting in a fiduciary or representative ca-3 4 5 pacity, whether appointed by a court or otherwise, and any combination of individuals. "Person" means all departments, commissions, agencies and instrumen-6 7 8 talities of the State, including counties and municipalities and agencies and instrumentalities thereof. 9
  - §372. State Lottery Bureau
- The State Lottery Bureau is established within
  the Department of Finance and Administration to carry
  out the purposes of this chapter.
- 14 §373. Director

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- The executive head of the bureau shall be the director.
- 1. Appointment; qualifications. The director 17 must be a person qualified by training and experience 18 19 to direct the State Lotteries. The director shall be appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the 20 21 joint standing committee of the Legislature having 22 jurisdiction over legal affairs and to confirmation by the Senate and shall serve during the pleasure of 23 the Governor. Any vacancy occurring in the office of 24 the director shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. The director shall devote 25 26 27 his entire time and attention to the duties of his 28 office.
- 29 <u>2. Powers and duties. The director shall have</u> 30 <u>the following powers and duties:</u>
- A. Supervise the operation of lotteries in accordance with this chapter and with the rules promulgated under this chapter;
  - B. Act as the chief administrative officer, having general charge of the office and records and to employ such personnel as may be necessary to fulfill the purposes of this chapter. The personnel shall be employed with the approval of the commissioner and subject to the Personnel Law,

- except for the deputy director who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the director;
- 4 C. Act as executive secretary of the commission;

- D. In accordance with this chapter and the rules promulgated under this chapter, license as agents to sell lottery tickets such persons, as in his opinion, who will best serve the public convenience and promote the sale of tickets or shares. The director may require a bond from every licensed agent in such amount as provided by rule. Every licensed agent shall prominently display his license, or a copy thereof, as provided by rule;
- E. Confer regularly as necessary or desirable and not less than once each month with the commission and the commissioner on the operation and administration of the lotteries; make available for inspection by the commission, upon request, all books, records, files and other information and documents of the commission; advise the commission and commissioner and recommend such matters as he deems necessary and advisable to improve the operation and administration of the lotteries;
- F. Recommend to the commission that it seek to suspend or revoke in a manner consistent with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, any license issued pursuant to this chapter or the rules promulgated thereunder;
- G. Subject to the approval of the commissioner and to any applicable laws relating to public contracts, enter into contracts for the operation of the lotteries, or any part thereof, and into contracts for the promotion of the lotteries. All contracts shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder and shall be let for a period not to exceed 3 years. No contract awarded or entered into by the director may be assigned by the holder thereof, except by specific approval of the commissioner;

- H. Certify monthly to the Treasurer of State, the commission, the commissioner and to the Gov-ernor a full and complete statement of lottery revenues, prize disbursements and other expenses for the preceding month; submit an annual report, through the commissioner and with his approval, which shall include a full and complete statement of lottery revenues, prize disbursements and expenses, to the Governor and the Legislature, gether with recommendations for changes in this chapter; and
  - I. Carry on a continuous study and investigation of the lotteries throughout the State, and the operation and administration of similar laws which may be in effect in other states or countries.

## §374. State Lottery Commission

The State Lottery Commission, established by Title 5, section 12004, subsection 8, shall consist of 5 members, all of whom shall be citizens and residents of this State, all of whom shall be appointed by the Governor and all of whom shall be subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over legal affairs and to confirmation by the Senate. No more than 3 of the 5 members may be members of the same political party. The members shall be appointed for terms of 5 years. The members shall annually elect one of them as chairman of the commission.

Any vacancy in the commission, occurring for any reason other than the expiration of term, shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.

Any member of the commission may be removed from office by the Governor if that member is absent from 3 consecutive regularly scheduled monthly meetings or 6 meetings in any fiscal year, or for other cause, upon notice and opportunity to be heard at a public hearing.

The members of the commission shall receive no salaries and shall be compensated as provided in Ti-

- tle 5, chapter 379. In addition, the commission members shall not be compensated for more than 20 meetings per year.
- 4 §375. Commission; powers and duties

5 The commission shall meet with the director, not 6 less than once each month, for the purpose of promul-7 gating and amending, subject to approval of the com-8 missioner, rules relating to the lotteries, to make 9 recommendations and set policy for state lotteries, 10 to approve or reject reports of the director and to 11 transact other business that may be properly brought before the commission. Rules adopted by the commis-12 13 sion shall be adopted in a manner consistent with the 14 Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 15 375.

- 16 <u>l. Rules. The rules promulgated by the commis-</u> 17 sion shall include, but not be limited to:
- 18 A. The types of lotteries to be conducted;
- 19 <u>B. The price of tickets or shares in the lotter-</u>
  20 <u>ies;</u>
- 21 <u>C. The number and size of the prizes on the</u> 22 winning tickets or shares;
- D. The manner of selecting the winning tickets or shares;
- 25 E. The manner of payment of prizes to the hold-26 ers of winning tickets or shares;
- 27 <u>F. The frequency of the drawings or selections</u> 28 <u>of winning tickets or shares;</u>
- 29 <u>G. The number or types of locations at which</u> 30 <u>tickets or shares may be sold;</u>
- 31 <u>H. The method to be used in selling tickets or</u> 32 shares;
- I. The licensing of agents to sell tickets or shares, but a person under the age of 18 shall not be licensed as an agent;

J. The license fee to be charged to agents;

- K. The manner and amount of compensation to be paid licensed sales agents necessary to provide for the adequate availability of tickets or shares to prospective buyers and for the convenience of the general public; and
  - L. The apportionment of the total annual revenue accruing from the sale of lottery tickets or shares and from all other sources for the payment of prizes to the holders of winning tickets or shares, for the payment of costs incurred in the operation and administration of the lotteries, including the expenses of the commission and the costs resulting from any contract or contracts entered into for promotional, advertising, consulting or operational services or for the purchase or lease of lottery equipment and materials, for the repayment of the money appropriated to the State Lottery Fund and for transfer to the General Fund for distribution pursuant to section 387.
  - No action of the commission is binding unless taken at a meeting at which at least 3 of the 5 members are present and vote in favor of the action. The minutes of every meeting of the commission, including any rules promulgated by the commission or any amendments, revisions, supplements or repeals, shall be forthwith transmitted, by and under the certification of the secretary, to the commissioner for his approval or disapproval and to the Governor.
- The commission and the bureau shall have no authority to regulate, control or otherwise supervise the operation or conduct of the amusement commonly known as "Beano" or "Bingo," as defined in Title 17, section 311.
  - §376. Lottery sales agent; licensing
- 1. Factors. A license as an agent to sell lottery tickets or shares may be issued by the director to any qualified person. Before issuing the license, the director shall consider such factors as:

- A. The financial responsibility and security of the person and his business or activity;
- B. The accessibility of his place of business or activity to the public;
- 5 <u>C. The sufficiency of existing licensees to</u> 6 serve the public convenience; and
- 7 D. The volume of expected sales.
- 8 §377. Authority to act
- 9 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any 10 person licensed as provided in this chapter is autho-11 rized and empowered to act as a lottery sales agent.
- 12 §378. Assignment of prizes
- No right of any person to a prize drawn may be assignable, except that payment of any prize drawn may be paid to the estate of a deceased prize winner, and except that any person pursuant to an appropriate judicial order may be paid the prize to which the winner is entitled. The bureau shall be discharged of all further liability upon payment of a prize pursuant to this section.
- 21 §379. Sales above fixed price; unlicensed sales; 22 gifts
- No person may sell a ticket or share at a price greater than that fixed by rule. No person other than a licensed lottery sales agent may sell lottery tickets or shares, except that nothing in this section prevents any person from giving lottery tickets or shares to another as a gift.
- Any person convicted of violating this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 31 §380. Sales to person under 18 years; gifts
- No ticket or share may be sold to any person under the age of 18 years, but this shall not be deemed to prohibit the purchase of a ticket or share for the purpose of making a gift by a person 18 years of age

- or older to a person less than that age. Any licensee 1 2 who knowingly sells or offers to sell a lottery tick-3 et or share to any person under the age of 18 shall, 4 upon conviction, be quilty of a misdemeanor.
  - §381. Persons prohibited from purchasing tickets or shares

No ticket or share may be purchased by, and no 8 prize may be paid to, any of the following persons: Any officer or employee of the commission or bureau 9 or to any spouse, child, brother, sister or parent 10 residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of abode of any of the foregoing per-11 13 sons.

## §382. Unclaimed prize money

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Unclaimed prize money for the prize on a winning ticket or share shall be retained by the director for the person entitled to it for one year after the drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made for the money within that year, the prize money shall be reallocated as prizes in the form of special promotions.

## §383. Deposit of receipts; reports

The director may require any and all lottery sales agents to deposit to the credit of the State Lottery Fund in banks designated by the Treasurer of State all money received by the agents from the sale of lottery tickets or shares, less the amount, if any, retained as compensation for the sale of tickets or shares, and to file with the director or his designated agents reports of their receipts and transactions in the sale of lottery tickets in such form and containing such information as he may require. director may make such arrangements for any person, including a bank, to perform the functions, activities or services in connection with the operation of the lottery as he may deem advisable pursuant to this chapter and the rules of the commission, and functions, activities or services shall constitute lawful functions, activities and services of that person.

1 §384. Other laws; applicability

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- No other law providing any penalty or disability for the sale of lottery tickets or any acts done in connection with a lottery applies to the sale of tickets or shares performed pursuant to this chapter.
- 6 §385. Persons under 18 years; payment of prizes
  - If the person entitled to a prize or any winning ticket is under the age of 18 years, and the prize is less than \$5,000, the director may direct payment of the prize by delivery, to an adult member of the minor's family or a guardian of the minor, of a check or draft payable to the order of the minor. If the person entitled to a prize or any ticket is under the age of 18 years, and the prize is \$5,000 or more, the director may direct payment to the minor by depositing the amount of the prize in any bank to the credit an adult member of the minor's family or guardian of the minor as custodian for the minor. The person so named as custodian shall have the same duties and powers as a person designated as a custodian in manner prescribed by the "Maine Uniform Gifts to Minors Act," and for purposes of this section the terms "adult member of a minor's family," "guardian of a minor" and "bank" shall have the same meaning as in that Act. The director shall be relieved of all further liability upon payment of a prize to a minor pursuant to this section.
- 28 §386. State Lottery Fund; creation
- 29 There is created and established a separate fund to be known as the "State Lottery Fund," to be depos-30 31 ited in the depositories as the Treasurer of State may select. These funds shall consist of all revenue 32 33 received from the sale of lottery tickets or shares, 34 agents' license fees and all other money credited or 35 transferred thereto from any other fund or source 36 pursuant to law.
- 37 §387. State Lottery Fund; appropriation of money
- 38 <u>l. Appropriation. The money in the State Lottery</u> 39 Fund shall be appropriated only:

1 2	A. For the payment of prizes to the holders of winning lottery tickets or shares;
3 4	B. For the expense of the division in its operation of the lottery; and
5	C. For payment to the General Fund.
6 7 8 9 10 11 12	2. Apportionment. The money in the State Lottery Fund shall be apportioned so that not less than 45% of the total ticket sales received in the lottery will be disbursed as prizes to holders of winning tickets. All other money, less reasonable costs for the proper administration of the fund State Lottery, will be the State's share.
13	§388. Maine State Income Tax; prizes exempt
14 15	The prizes received pursuant to this chapter shall be exempt from the Maine State Income Tax.
16 17 18 19	Sec. 8. Transition clause. All existing rules of the State Lottery Commission currently in effect and operation shall continue in effect until rescinded, amended or changed.
20 21 22 23	All assets, liabilities, revenues, funds, property and personnel of the State Lottery Commission shall be transferred to the State Lottery Bureau by the State Controller.
24 25 26 27	Members of the State Lottery Commission serving on the effective date of this Act shall continue to serve the remainder of their terms as members of the commission established by this Act.
28	STATEMENT OF FACT
29 30 31 32	This bill places the duties and functions of the Lottery Director and State Lottery Commission within the executive department of Finance and Administration.
