background with a printed inscription. The inscription shall read: "Handicapped Parking: Special Plate Required. Unauthorized vehicles are subject to a fine." The other signs rized under this paragraph and which may be posted in lieu of the first sign shall consist of a profile view of a wheelchair with an occupant white on a blue background which may bear an inscription. Any new sign erected or any replaced after the effective date of this paragraph shall conform to the signs authorized by this paragraph. Any existing posted signs that do not conform to the provisions of this paragraph and which were erected prior to the effective date of this paragraph shall be deemed to be valid for enforcement purposes. Any vehicle parked in a parking space designated by a municipality as a handicapped parking space that does not bear a special registration plate or placard issued under Title 29, section 252, or a similar plate issued by another state, shall be cited for a penalty not to exceed \$25 unless otherwise established by local ordinance. Owners of private off-street parking may enter into agreements with local or county law enforcement agencies for the policing of stalls and spaces dedicated for handicapped persons! vehicles, under which agreements unauthorized vehicles shall be tagged. Local and county law enforcement agencies shall, upon written request of any owner of private off-street parking, police stalls and spaces dedicated handicapped persons' vehicles, and shall tag unauthorized vehicles. Where service facilities established on the Maine Turnpike and on the interstate highway system in Maine, the State Police shall enforce this subsection.
