	20-A MRSA §5401, sub-§11, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 693, §§5 and 8, is amended to read:
	11. Minimum distances. A school board may establish the distance from a school that students must reside to receive transportation. Except as provided for in subsection 7, when a school board uses the
	distance between a student's place of residence and a school to determine eligibility for busing that distance should be measured from the front door of the residence to the front door of the school.
