- 3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 4 follows:
- 5 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §4085, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 6 1985, c. 441, §3, is amended to read:
- 7 2. Limit on disbursements. The board may not expend the first \$100,000 of income to the fund each 8 9 year; except that \$7,125 may be expended from the fund in fiscal year 1985-86 to further the purposes of this chapter. The board may expend one half of 10 11 the amount of income each year which exc \$100,000, but which does not exceed \$500,000. 12 exceeds 13 14 board may not expend the amount of income each year 15 which exceeds \$500,000. For purposes of this sec-16 tion, income includes interest attributed to the fund 17 pursuant to Title 36, section 5285. When the 18 amount of the fund reaches \$4,000,000, contributions 19 to the fund shall cease, as provided in Title 36, 20 section 5285, and the expenditures by the board shall 21 be limited to the amount of interest credited annual-22 ly to the fund.
