14	'FISCAL NOTE
15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28	This bill requires no additional appropriations in this biennium. After July 1, 1987, the State will be required to pay 100% of state agency clients' special education costs directly to school units or service providers. These direct payments are estimated to be approximately \$6,000,000. The future net cost will be approximately 1/2 of the direct payments due to a reduction in school subsidies. The phase-in mechanism will further reduce the initial cost to the State. The additional appropriations needed to meet the requirements of this bill will increase from approximately \$500,000 in fiscal year 1987-88 to approximately 1/2 of the total direct payments after July 1, 1992.
29 30 31 32 33	The bill also allows future Legislatures the option of expanding certain services for these state agency clients by appropriating additional funds. The estimated cost to fully fund these services in fiscal year 1987-88 is approximately \$5,000,000.'
