The commission shall consist of 7 members appointed as follows: Two by the Governor; 2 by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court; one by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; one by the President of the Senate; and a chairman appointed jointly by the Governor, Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court, Speaker of the House of Representatives and President of the Senate. The members shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for reasonable expenses as provided in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12002-A, subsection 1. The commission shall advice the Office of the Bicentennial of the Constitution as set out in this resolve; and be it further

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Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall prepare a project plan designed to interest and educate the public regarding our constitutional form of government and coordinate with schools, scholars, public service organizations, representatives of the media, the judiciary, the Legislature and the Governor's office to see that both local and statewide activities are planned and undertaken. The commission authorized to receive funds from any source, governmental or private, and to disburse the same for the purpose of carrying out its functions and in aiding other governmental and nonprofit organizations to commemorate the bicentennial of the United States Constitution. The commission is also authorized to cooperate as it deems appropriate with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts or any appropriate governmental or nonprofit organization in that state in promoting the celebration of the bicentennial of the United States Constitution; and be it further

Report to Legislature. Resolved: That the commission, by January 30, 1988, shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over State Government with respect to its income of the office from all sources and detailed expenditures of the office during the life of the office; and be it further

Appropriation. Resolved: That the sum of \$25,000 is appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of the office. These funds shall not lapse on June 30, 1986, but shall carry forward until the purposes of the office have been achieved.'
