1 Whereas, the bicentennial of the United States 2 Constitution will be celebrated throughout the United 3 States; and

4 Whereas, it is particularly appropriate that the State, which as the District of Maine, was a part 5 of 6 one of the original 13 states, should officially rec-7 ognize its rich historical tradition and should coop-8 erate with the present Commonwealth of Massachusetts 9 in celebrating the part that Massachusetts played in 10 the writing and adoption of the United States Consti-11 tution; and

12 Whereas, matching grants and funds may be availa-13 ble to the State for the purpose of encouraging pub-14 lic observance of the bicentennial upon the timely 15 establishment of a commission; and

16 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, 17 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of 18 the Constitution of Maine and require the following 19 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-20 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 21 therefore, be it

22 Commission established. Resolved: That there 23 shall be established a commission to commemorate the 24 bicentennial of the United States Constitution. The 25 commission shall consist of 7 members appointed as Two by the Governor; 2 by the Chief Justice 26 follows: 27 of the Supreme Judicial Court; one by the Speaker of 28 the House of Representatives; one by the President of 29 Senate; and a chairman appointed jointly by the the 30 Governor, Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial 31 Court, Speaker of the House of Representatives and President of the Senate. The members 32 serve shall 33 without compensation, but may be reimbursed for rea-34 sonable expenses as provided in the Maine Revised 35 Statutes, Title 5, section 12002-A, subsection 1; and 36 be it further

37 **Personnel.** Resolved: That the commission shall 38 commence its work on the effective date of this re-39 solve and shall continue in existence through Decem-40 ber 31, 1987. It may employ a project director, who 41 shall serve with compensation and who shall be re-42 sponsible to the commission. Employees of the com1 mission shall not be subject to the personnel laws 2 affecting state employees. The Office of the Gover-3 nor, the legislative staff and the Administrative Of-4 fice of the Courts are authorized to furnish the com-5 mission clerical and other support services upon its 6 request; and be it further

7 That the Duties. Resolved: commission shall 8 prepare a project plan designed to interest and educate the public regarding our constitutional form of 9 government and coordinate with 10 schools, scholars, 11 public service organizations, representatives of the media, the judiciary, the Legislature and the Gover-12 13 nor's office to see that both local and statewide ac-14 tivities are planned and undertaken. The commission 15 authorized to receive funds from any source, govis 16 ernmental or private, and to disburse the same for 17 the purpose of carrying out its functions and in aid-18 ing other governmental and nonprofit organizations to 19 commemorate the bicentennial of the United States The commission is also authorized 20 Constitution. to 21 it deems appropriate with the Commoncooperate as wealth of Massachusetts or any appropriate governmen-tal or nonprofit organization in that state in pro-22 23 24 moting the celebration of the bicentennial of the 25 United States Constitution; and be it further

26 Appropriation. Resolved: That the sum of 27 \$40,500 is appropriated from the General Fund to car-28 ry out the purposes of the commission.

29 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited 30 in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when 31 approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

2 At the request of the Governor, the Speaker of 3 the House of Representatives, the President of the 4 Senate and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court, this resolve establishes a commission to com-5 6 memorate the bicentennial of the signing of the 7 United States Constitution. The commission's purpose 8 to organize and stimulate interesting and educais 9 tional events designed to focus public attention upon 10 the importance of our constitutional form of govern-11 The stability of our society rests largely ment. 12 upon the public's confidence in the constitution.

13 The commission will serve without compensation, 14 but will have a paid project director and part-time 15 clerical assistance. The commission will be eligible 16 to apply for grant funds and will aid local schools, 17 libraries, civic groups, and communities in planning 18 interesting projects and in applying for grant funds.
