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**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts and resolves  
of the Legislature do not become effective until 90  
days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies;  
and

Whereas, Somerset County has certain expenses and  
liabilities which must be met as they become due; and

Whereas, it is necessary that the taxes for the  
year 1986 hereinafter mentioned be immediately as-  
sessed in order to provide the required revenue for  
the county; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,  
these facts create an emergency within the meaning of
