21 22 23 24	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: Sec. 1. 34-B MRSA §5402, sub-§5 is enacted to read:
25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36	5. Mental Retardation Trainer Apprenticeship Program. A Mental Retardation Trainer Apprenticeship Program is established at the Pineland Center to pro- vide education and skill development for direct care staff to allow them to become knowledgeable and expe- rienced journeymen in the mental retardation field. This program shall be designed to provide individu- als with sufficient knowledge to work as paraprofessionals in a multitude of disciplines, in- cluding, but not limited to, physical therapy, occu- pational therapy, recreation therapy and speech ther- apy.

1 Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are 2 appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the 3 purposes of this Act. 1986-87 4 1985-86 5 MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION, 6 DEPARTMENT OF 7 Pineland Center 8 Personal Services \$57,427 \$86,170 9 The purpose of this 10 appropriation is to 11 fund the Mental Re-12 tardation Trainer Ap-13 prenticeship Program 14 at Pineland Center. 15 This money shall 16 be used to fund 17 reclassifications 18 for workers who have 19 completed the program 20 and are eligible for 21 reclassification 22 upgrade to Mental Re-23 tardation Trainer, 24 but have not yet been 25 reclassified. In ad-26 dition, \$40,000 in 27 fiscal year 1986-87 28 shall be used to fund 29 upgrades for 20 em-30 ployees to begin the 31 Mental Retardation 32 Trainer Apprentice-33 ship Program.

FISCAL NOTE

2 The appropriation funds reclassification upgrades for all employees who have currently completed the 3 4 Mental Retardation Trainer Apprenticeship Program and 5 are eligible for a Mental Retardation Trainer classi-6 This includes \$57,427 for fiscal year fication. 7 1985-86 and \$46,170 for fiscal year 1986-87. In adfunds are appropriated for fiscal 8 vear dition, 9 1986-87 to continue the Mental Retardation Trainer 10 Apprenticeship Program for at least 20 employees each This will require \$40,000 in fiscal year 11 year. 12 1986-87 and approximately \$45,000 for the next fiscal 13 year.

STATEMENT OF FACT

15 Pineland Center developed a Mental Retardation 16 Trainer Apprenticeship Program approximately 4 years 17 ago through a cooperative agreement with the State, 18 A.F.S.C.M.E., AFL/CIO and the Federal Department of This was a 2-year program designed to in-19 Labor. crease the knowledge and skill of the direct care 20 21 staff to ensure that Pineland Center has the trained staff capable of working in all facets of mental re-22 tardation at an optimal level. There are currently 23 24 employees who have been enrolled in the program 24 25 and who are eligible for reclassification upgrades to 26 Mental Retardation Trainer, but who have not been re-27 classified. This bill provides the funding for those 28 reclassifications.

In addition, this bill reestablishes the Mental Retardation Trainer Apprenticeship Program and funds employees to begin the training program. The funding is for potential upgrades at the end of the first year of training.

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
