- Sec. 2. Credible service for preschool teachers and personnel of preschool coordination projects. The intent of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1001, subsection 25, is as follows:
- 1. Preschool teachers. To clarify that preschool teachers hired by public schools should always have been included in the definition of "teacher" under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1001, subsection 25, and that those hired before the effective date of this Act shall be considered members of the Maine State Retirement System from the date they were hired; and
- 2. Preschool coordination project personnel. To include in the definition of "teacher" under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1001, subsection 25, preschool coordination project personnel who were hired before July 1, 1986, and
 - A. Who elected to join the Maine State Retirement System; or
 - B. If they were already a member because of prior employment as a teacher or state employee, who elected to continue their membership in, the Maine State Retirement System.
- These teachers shall be considered members of the Maine State Retirement System from the date they were hired or first became members of the system, whichever comes first.
- Preschool coordination project personnel who did not elect to join the Maine State Retirement System or those who were first hired by a preschool project after July 1, 1986, shall not have the right to be mem-

This bill grandfathers those preschool coordination project staff who elected to become members of 3 4 the Maine State Retirement System when they were 5 hired. It also clarifies that preschool coordination project personnel who did not elect to join the sys-6 7 tem or who were hired after July 1, 1986, shall be 8 part of the United States Social Security System. It 9 also makes it clear that preschool teachers hired by 10 school administrative units should be included in the definition of "teacher" by the Maine State Retirement 11 1.2 System. It is meant to clarify existing practice 13 where these individuals are presently contributing to 14 the Maine State Retirement System.
