This new draft will incur an initial cost to the General Fund of \$228,787 for the fiscal year 1986-87. In the subsequent years, the Capital Expenditures and All Other costs included in this appropriation will not be necessary.

24 STATEMENT OF FACT

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The purpose of this new draft is to establish the requirement of a fiscal note for each legislative document and state agency rule to describe the fiscal impact of each proposed law and agency rule upon municipalities, counties and school administrative units. By being made aware of the costs of proposed laws and agency rules, Legislators and state agencies may be able to make decisions with greater facility than previously.

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
