7 8 9	HOUSE AMENDMENT " $\mathbf{A}$ " to H.P. 1540, L.D. 2171, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to a New Registration Plate Issue."
10 11	Amend the bill by striking out all of the emergency preamble.
12 13 14	Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting in its place the following:
15 16	'Sec. 1. 29 MRSA c. 5, Art. I-A is enacted to read:
17	ARTICLE I-A
18	ISSUE OF REGISTRATION PLATES
19	§131. Registration plate issues
20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27	The Secretary of State shall provide a new general issue of registration plates every 6 years for all vehicles required to be registered in this State for operation on Maine highways. The first new general issue of registration plates shall commence on July 1, 1987, and successive new general issues of registration plates shall be issued every 6 years thereafter.
28 29 30	Each new general issue of registration plates as required by this section shall be easily distinguishable from the preceding general issue.
31 32 33 34	The following design elements are guidelines to be followed by the Secretary of State in the production of new plates to be issued from July 1987 to December 1992. A new plate shall have a white back-

- ground; identification numbers and letters and the 2 border shall be distinctly navy blue in color with any graphic material appearing in a color distinctly 3 lobster red, featuring an illustration of a lobster. The name of the State "Maine" shall appear centered 4 5 appear centered 6 the top of the plate and the designation 7 "Vactionland" shall appear centered at the bottom. 8 This guidance is meant to be applied in accordance 9 with the authority held by the Secretary of State in section 110. 10
- The Secretary of State shall adopt rules in accordance with Title 5, chapter 375, to implement this article. In these rules, the Secretary of State may include provisions to protect the integrity of the Maine motor vehicle registration plate, to provide for the issue of replacement plates and any other provisions to facilitate the implementation of this article.
- 19 §132. Fees for new issues of registration plates
- A fee of \$1 for each registration plate shall be collected by the Secretary of State from the vehicle registrant for new registration plate issues as referred to in section 131. This fee shall be in addition to any other registration fees required by this Title.
- Sec. 2. 29 MRSA §191, as amended by PL 1983, c. 455, §10, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
- 29 §191. Reservation of same number
- 1. Plate issue year. The Secretary of State shall reserve until July 1st the same registration number for the succeeding registration year for persons who notify the Secretary of State prior to April 1st in writing of their desire to retain their registration number. The fee for retention of the same registration number is \$5.

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1 2 3 4 5 6 7	If a person wishes to retain his registration number and does not have a vehicle to register on July 1st, he may hold his registration number for a maximum of 2 registration years by depositing with the Secretary of State the sum of \$10 for each year. These fees are not refundable and shall not be applied as part payment of the registration fee.
8 9 10 11 12	All numbers other than those reserved shall be re- leased and issued in rotation after July 1st, except that a person wishing to select a number out of rota- tion may do so by paying his registration fee and a reserved number fee of \$5.
13 14 15	Holders of initial plates shall pay the sum of \$15 which shall be credited toward renewal of the initial plates reserved.
16 17 18 19 20 21	2. Nonplate issue year. When a person fails to reregister during a nonplate issue year and the registration remains expired for 6 consecutive months, his reservation of the same number may cease and the number becomes available for reissuance or reassignment, or both.
22 23 24	Sec. 3. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from the Highway Fund to carry out the purpose of this Act.

13 14	This amendment requires the Highway Fund allocations in the following fiscal years:
15 16	Fiscal Year 1987 \$1,633,190 Fiscal Year 1988 \$ 407,700
17 18	The total Highway Fund allocations over the 2 fiscal years will be \$2,040,890.
19 20 21 22 23	Highway Fund revenues will increase, due to the \$1 per plate fee and the \$5 fee for "reserved" or "out-of-sequence" plates, by approximately \$1,865,000. These revenues will not be collected until the fiscal year 1988.

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#### STATEMENT OF FACT

During the First Regular Session of the 112th Legislature, the Division of Motor Vehicles requested the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation to allocate highway funds for a new general issue of registration plates in 1986. The Division of Motor Vehicles justified its request by explaining that registration plates were meant to have a useful life of 6 years, but current plates are more than 10 years old. As a result of extended exposure to the elements, many plates have deteriorated seriously and there is evidence to show that the battered and faded condition of the plates hampers law enforcement efforts.

The Joint Standing Committee on Transportation requested authorization to study this problem and to come up with a solution. In the study process, the committee learned 2 important pieces of information which point to necessary action.

- 1. A survey of evasion of motor vehicle registration in Maine undertaken by the Department of Transportation shows an evasion rate of 4.7% which translates into an annual loss of \$500,000 in registration fees to the Highway Fund and an annual loss of \$1,100,000 in excise tax revenues to municipalities.
- 2. Registration files at the Division of Motor Vehicles must be purged. Current Division of Motor Vehicles files do not indicate active, valid registrations; inactive registrations; or invalid registrations. Presently, the Division of Motor Vehicles estimates that over 500,000 invalid registrations appear in their records, but they cannot be readily distinguished.

The committee reviewed several proposals and finally directed the Division of Motor Vehicles to prepare L.D. 263 which was discussed at length along

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with counter proposals from various sources, includthe Secretary of State. Uncertainty about the best way to finance the reissue prompted the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation to hold the bill 5 over to this Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature for further consideration. This amendment calls for general issue registration plates every 6 years and the first new general 8 issue will begin on July 1, 1987. 10 Section 1 establishes the date for a new plate issue and a fee for the new plate, which should gen-11 erate revenue of approximately \$1,865,000. 12 13 Section 2 provides for the reservation of plate 14 numbers. Section 3 provides funds to carry out the purpose 15 16 of this amendment. 17 6724031186
