Whereas, Maine needs to establish a general reissue schedule at 6-year intervals to prevent future delays in distributing new plates; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

10 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

12 Sec. 1. 29 MRSA c. 5, Art. 1-A is enacted to 13 read:

14 ARTICLE I-A

ISSUE OF REGISTRATION PLATES

16 §131. Registration plate issues

The Secretary of State shall provide a new general issue of registration plates every 6 years for all vehicles required to be registered in this State for operation on state highways. The first new general issue of registration plates shall commence on April 1, 1987, and successive new general issues of registration plates shall be issued every 6 years thereafter.

Each new general issue of registration plates as required by this section shall be easily distinguishable from the preceding general issue.

The following design elements are guidelines to be followed by the Secretary of State in the production of new plates to be issued from April 1987 to December 1992. A new plate shall have a navy blue background; identification numbers and letters shall be white in color. The name of the State "Maine" shall appear centered at the top of the plate and the designation "Vacationland" shall appear centered at the bottom. This guidance is meant to be applied in accordance with the authority held by the Secretary of State in section 110.

The Secretary of State shall adopt rules in accordance with Title 5, chapter 375, to implement this article. In these rules, the Secretary of State may include provisions to protect the integrity of the state motor vehicle registration plate, to provide for the issue of replacement plates and any other provisions to facilitate the implementation of this article.

§132. Fees for new issues of registration plates

10 A fee of \$1 for each registration plate shall be collected by the Secretary of State from the vehicle 11 registrant for new registration plate issues as re-12 ferred to in section 131. This fee shall be in addi-13 14 tion to any other registration fees required by this 15 Title.

16 Sec. 2. 29 MRSA §191, as amended by PL 1983, 17 455, §10, is repealed and the following enacted in 18 its place:

§191. Reservation of same number

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- 1. Plate issue year. The Secretary of State 20 shall reserve until April 1st the same registration 21 22 number for the succeeding registration year for persons who shall notify the Secretary of State prior to January 1st in writing of their desire to retain 23 24 their registration number. The fee for retention of 25 26 the same registration number is \$5.
- 27 If a person wishes to retain his registration number and does not have a vehicle to register on April 1st, 28 he may hold his registration number for a maximum of 29 30 2 registration years by depositing with the Secretary 31 of State the sum of \$10 for each year. These fees are not refundable and shall not be applied as part 32 33 payment of the registration fee.
- 34 All numbers other than those reserved shall be released and issued in rotation after April 1st, except 35 36 that a person wishing to select a number out of rota-37 tion may do so by paying his registration fee and a reserved number fee of \$5. 38

2 Enactment of this new draft will require Highway 3 Fund allocations in the following fiscal years:

7 The total Highway Fund allocations over the 3 fiscal years will be \$1,512,057.

9 Highway Fund revenues will increase due to the \$1 10 per plate fee and the \$5 fee for "reserved" or 11 "out-of-sequence" plates, as follows:

The total increased revenues to the Highway Fund over the 3 fiscal years will be \$1,865,000.

17 STATEMENT OF FACT

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18 During the First Regular Session of the 19 Legislature, the Division of Motor Vehicles requested the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation to al-20 21 locate highway funds for a new general issue of registration plates in 1986. The Division of Motor Ve-22 23 hicles justified its request by explaining that reg-24 istration plates were meant to have a useful life of years, but current plates were more than 10 years 25 26 As a result of extended exposure to the ele-27 ments, many plates have deteriorated seriously and there is evidence to show that the battered and faded 28 29 condition of the plates hampers law enforcement ef-30 forts.

The Joint Standing Committee on Transportation requested authorization to study this problem and to come up with a solution. In the study process the committee learned 2 important pieces of information which point to necessary action.

1. A survey of evasion of motor vehicle regis-

tration in Maine undertaken by the Department of Transportation shows an evasion rate of 4.7% which translates into an annual loss of \$500,000 in registration fees to the Highway Fund and an annual loss of \$1,100,000 in excise tax revenues to municipalities.

2. Registration files at the Division of Motor Vehicles must be purged. Current Division of Motor Vehicles files do not indicate active, valid registrations; inactive registrations; or invalid registrations. Presently, the Division of Motor Vehicles estimates that over 500,000 invalid registrations appear in their records, but they cannot be readily distinguished.

The committee reviewed several proposals and finally directed the Division of Motor Vehicles to prepare L.D. 263 which was discussed at length along with counter proposals from various sources, including the Secretary of State. Uncertainty about the best way to finance the reissue prompted the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation to hold the bill over to this Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature for further consideration.

This new draft calls for a general issue of registration plates every 6 years. The first new general issue will begin on April 1, 1987.

Section 1 establishes the date for a new plate issue and a fee for the new plate, which should generate revenue of approximately \$1,865,000.

30 Section 2 provides for the reservation of plate 31 numbers.

Section 3 provides funds to carry out the purpose of this new draft.

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
