STATEMENT OF FACT

2 Nonresident commercial fisherman are charged \$900 3 for a license to land product in the State, clearly a disincentive. The success of the Portland fish pier 4 5 will depend in large part on the availability of fisheries products to be traded there. Decreasing 6 7 the license fee for nonresident boats will be an in-8 centive toward that end. While there will be a small decrease in revenue to the General Fund based on ex-9 10 isting license sales to nonresidents, the decreased fee may in fact increase revenue to the General Fund 11 given future increases in license sales to nonresi-12 13 dents.

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
