24 25 26	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
27 28 29	Whereas, school administrative units will be establishing their calendars for the 1986-87 school year this spring and early summer; and
30 31	Whereas, the 90-day period for regular bills to take effect will not be over until July; and
32 33 34 35	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-

3 4	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
5	20-A MRSA §4801, sub-§1, ¶C is enacted to read:
6 7 8 9	C. Notwithstanding this subsection, the commissioner shall promulgate a rule to provide that local school units may allow secondary school students to graduate up to 5 school days prior to the regular end of the school year.
11 12 13	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
14	STATEMENT OF FACT
15 16 17 18 19 20	This new draft adds an emergency preamble and clause to the bill. It also changes the bill from allowing the school board to set a graduation date up to 7 days before the end of school to giving the commissioner authority to establish a rule to allow graduation before the end of the school year.
