	AN ACT to Correct Eligibility Requirements for Licensure as a Master Electrician.
	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
	Whereas, certain persons were working as apprentice or helper electricians in 1981 when the law became effective; and
	Whereas, these persons were allowed to progress to the journeyman level under the former law; and
	Whereas, a provision for them to progress to the master level under the former law was inadvertently left out; and
	Whereas, this would cause a great hardship for certain journeyman electricians to meet current requirements; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

32 MRSA §1202, sub-§1, ¶A, as repealed and replaced by PL 1981, c. 670, is amended to read:

For a journeyman electrician's or limited license, at least 8,000 hours of service as an apprentice or helper electrician or at least hours of experience in electrical installations as defined in section 1101, and satisfactory completion of a program of study comprising 576 as approved by the Electricians' Examining Board and completion of a course of not less than 45 hours in the current National Electrical Code, the course to be approved by the board. A graduate of a regional vocational high school 2-year electrical program approved by the Electricians' Examining Board shall be eligible to write journeyman's examination, as long as he worked for 8,000 hours in the field of electrical installations under the supervision of a master electrician or the equivalent. Any person who has at least 2 years' service as an apprentice or helper electrician may take the examination for a journeyman's or limited license and shall receive a license if he passes, provided that he was censed as an apprentice or helper electrician under subsection 3 on January 1, 1981, that he applies for the examination in accordance with section 1203 before January 1, 1983, and that takes the examination within 6 months of his becoming eligible to do so. Upon the effective date of this paragraph, the board shall notify, by certified mail, return receipt requested, all persons who were licensed as apprentice or helper electricians on January 1, 1981, of the provisions of the preceding sentence. For a master electrician's license, at least 4,000 hours of service as a journeyman electrician or at least

1 12,000 hours of service as an apprentice or 2 helper electrician or at least 12,000 hours of experience in electrical installations, as de-3 4 fined in section 1101, and satisfactory comple-5 tion of a program of study comprising 576 hours as approved by the Electricians' Examining Board 6 7 and completion of a course of not less than 45 hours in the current National Electrical Code, 8 9 course to be approved by the Electricians' Examining Board. Any person who holds a journey-man electrician's or limited license issued prior 10 11 to June 18, 1981, or any person licensed as an 12 apprentice or helper electrician under subsection 2 on January 1, 1981, who received a journeyman's 13 14 15 or limited license pursuant to this section shall 16 be eligible to take the examination for a master electrician's license, provided that the appli-17 18 cant has completed the number of hours of service or experience required by this subsection; and 19

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

In 1981 when the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 32, section 1202, was added, certain persons already working toward licensure as electricians were permitted to progress to the journeyman level under the former law. A provision for them to progress to the master level under the former law was inadvertently left out.

These same individuals would now have to go back to school with beginning electricians in order to be allowed to take the examination for the master electricians' level. It would cause a great hardship for these individuals to give up jobs in order to get required, but unnecessary, schooling.
