18 AN ACT Relating to Driver Education for the
19 Handicapped and Already Licensed
20 Individuals.

22 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
23 follows:

24 32 MRSA §9602, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1981, c.
25 456, Pt. A, §113, is amended to read:

26 3. Training vehicles. Every vehicle used as a
27 training vehicle shall be maintained in safe mechanical
28 condition at all times. Each Class 3 vehicle, as
29 defined in Title 29, section 530, shall be equipped
30 with dual foot brakes and, if the vehicle is not
31 equipped with an automatic transmission, dual clutch
32 pedals. While engaged in actual instruction, every
33 vehicle must be equipped with an identification sign,
34 listing the name of the school, and a student driver
35 sign.

1 The following vehicles are exempt from this subsection:
2

3 A. Any vehicle, specially equipped for use by a
4 handicapped person, which is being used to in-
5 struct a handicapped person; and

6 B. Any vehicle, which is being used to instruct
7 a person in possession of a valid Maine driver's
8 license and belonging to that person.

9 STATEMENT OF FACT

10 This bill creates an exemption in the driver edu-
11 cation law to allow handicapped persons and persons
12 with a valid Maine driver's license to receive driver
13 education in their own vehicle.
