19 20 21 22 23	Resolve, to Establish a Commission to Study the Integration of the Maine State Retirement System with the Social Security System.
24 25 26 27	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
28 29 30 31	Whereas, the United States Congress is actively considering various proposals for the mandatory coverage of all state and municipal employees under the United States Social Security or Medicare; and
32 33 34 35	Whereas, the Legislature needs to have assessed the components of the 2 systems before they can act on methods of integrating them if that is required by the Federal Government; and

Whereas, in order to ease the burden on the staffs of the State Planning Office and the Maine State Retirement System and thereby avoid the added costs inherent in rush requests for information; and

Whereas, for these reasons it is desirable for the commission to start work as soon as possible; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Integration of the Maine State Retirement System and United States Social Security. Resolved: That the Federal Government is moving in the direction of universal mandatory coverage of the United States Social Security System; and be it further

Resolved: That prior to any federally mandated inclusion of members of the Maine State Retirement System into the United States Social Security System, or voluntary election of membership by the State and its employees, there needs to be a review of the benefit structures and costs of both systems to determine the impact on State Government and local government and their employees of developing an integrated system; and be it further

Joint Select Commission to study the integration of the Maine State Retirement System with the United States Social Security System formed; appointment; expenses. Resolved: That there shall be formed a Joint Select Commission to Study the Integration of the Maine State Retirement System with the United States Social Security System comprised of the following members.

1. The following members shall be appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives: Two members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate; 2 members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

- 1 2. Three public members shall be appointed by the Governor.
- 3 3. The members of the commission shall be paid 4 reasonable expenses and a per diem equal to the leg-5 islative per diem; and be it further
- 6 Chairman. Resolved: That the members of the 7 commission shall select one of their members to be 8 chairman of the commission; and be it further
- 9 Resolved: That this Joint Select Com-Report. 10 mission to Study the Integration of the Maine State Retirement System with the United States Social Secu-11 12 rity System shall prepare and present a report to the 13 Governor and the Legislature no later than January 1, This report shall include, but not be limited 14 1987. 15 to:
- 1. A review of the public policy under which the United States Social Security System was established and the conditions under which State Government and local government may establish independent systems;

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- 2. A comparison of the benefits available under the Maine State Retirement System with those available under the United States Social Security System. The comparison shall include an assessment of the actual benefits received by various categories of recipients based on their length of service, level of earnings and their memberships or their spouses' membership in other retirement systems;
- 3. An analysis of the contribution of employers and employees under both systems. Based upon the actuarial assumptions of the 2 systems, assess the cost of the various components of each system and where possible relate the differences in the premium rates of both systems to the exclusion or inclusion of different categories of individuals from coverage;
- 4. A review of the January 14, 1986, Tillinghast Report to the Maine State Retirement System, "Proposal for Designing a Program to Coordinate with the Federal Social Security System" and discuss its policy recommendations with the Board of Directors of the Maine State Retirement System; and

5. A public hearing to allow interested employer and employee groups to express their opinions of the advantages or disadvantages of both systems and of the possibility of coordinating the benefits available under the 2 systems; and be it further

Staff support. Resolved: That the State Planning Office and the Maine State Retirement System shall provide technical assistance in conducting the statistical analysis comparing benefit levels for the various categories of recipients outlined in this resolve. The commission may request staff assistance from the Legislative Council to carry out and coordinate the analysis and to assist the commission; and be it further

Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purpose of this resolve.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

The new draft makes it clear that the study shall produce an analysis of the differences and similarities in benefit and contribution structures of the Maine State Retirement System and the United States Social Security System with the intent of providing background information with which to evaluate proposals for integrating the 2 systems. The intent is not to assess for fiscal impact of any particular proposal to coordinate the 2 systems.

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
