This bill establishes a \$500,000 training fund in order to enhance Maine's position in creating jobs by meeting the training needs of labor intensive new or expanding industries.

The 15-county service development area will administer and coordinate training activities under the fund in conjunction with its federally funded Job Training Partnership Act training programs. Cumberland County will participate in this program.

Funds will be expended in accordance to a coordination process which maximizes the resources of the service development areas', vocational-technical institutes, Finance Authority of Maine and State Development Office into an integrated strategy to attract jobs through training for the State. The program will be implemented as directed by the 15-county service development areas Private Industry Council.

The project will build upon existing programs and resources in order to expand training opportunities for the job training partnership program, eligibles and the public-at-large.
