AN ACT Concerning the Job Development  
Training Fund.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

**Appropriation.** The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

These funds to be expended for job development training under the direction of the 15-county Private Industry Council.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

2           This bill establishes a \$500,000 training fund in  
3 order to enhance Maine's position in creating jobs by  
4 meeting the training needs of labor intensive new or  
5 expanding industries.

6           The 15-county service development area will ad-  
7 minister and coordinate training activities under the  
8 fund in conjunction with its federally funded Job  
9 Training Partnership Act training programs. Cumber-  
10 land County will participate in this program.

11           Funds will be expended in accordance to a coordi-  
12 nation process which maximizes the resources of the  
13 service development areas', vocational-technical in-  
14 stitutes, Finance Authority of Maine and State Devel-  
15 opment Office into an integrated strategy to attract  
16 jobs through training for the State. The program  
17 will be implemented as directed by the 15-county ser-  
18 vice development areas Private Industry Council.

19           The project will build upon existing programs and  
20 resources in order to expand training opportunities  
21 for the job training partnership program, eligibles  
22 and the public-at-large.

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
