1	STATEMENT OF FACT
2 3 4 5 6 7	The purpose of this amendment is to establish an increase in the minimum lobster measure of 1/8 inch over a 5-year period. Such an increase is conditional on a federal minimum size and prohibition on possession of v-notched lobsters as required in the original bill.
8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15	The Botsford study of lobster industry estimates that catch and revenue will decline between 2% and 4% over the transition period and that catch and revenue will increase by more than 5% after the transition period. Egg production will approximately double. Thus, by keeping the annual changes in the measure to 1/32 inch, the negative impact on the industry will be minimal.
16 17	This amendment will also make Maine efforts consistent with similar legislation in Massachusetts.
