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HOUSE AMENDMENT "B" to H.P. 1627, L.D. 2295,

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Bill, "AN ACT Establishing a Commission to Implement

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Computerization of Criminal History Record Informa-

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tion."

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Amend the bill in section 2 by striking out all

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of the first paragraph and inserting in its place the

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following:

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'Sec. 2. Appointment. The commission shall consist

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of 12 members, as follows: Two Senators, appointed

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by the President of the Senate; 2 Representatives,

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appointed by the Speaker of the House of Rep-

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resentatives; the Attorney General or his designee;

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the Commissioner of Public Safety or his designee;

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the Director of the State Bureau of Identification or

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his designee; the State Court Administrator or his

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designee; a member of the Maine Prosecutors Associa-

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tion and a member of the Maine Chiefs of Police Associa-

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tion, each to be jointly appointed by the Speaker

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of the House of Representatives and the President of

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the Senate from lists of members selected and pro-

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posed by the president of the respective organiza-

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tions; the Commissioner of Corrections or his designee;

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and the Director of the Bureau of Central Computer

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Services or his designee. The Warden of the

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Maine State Prison shall advise the commission upon

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request. The commission shall ask the Chief Justice

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of the Supreme Judicial Court to appoint a judge or

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justice to serve as an advisor to the commission.'

3       bers from the respective presidents of the Maine  
4       Prosecutors Association and the Maine Chiefs of Po-
