15 16 17	IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SIX
18 19 20 21 22	AN ACT to Encourage the Rehabilitation of Members Receiving Disability Benefits under the Maine State Retirement System.
23 24	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
25	5 MRSA §1122, sub-§8 is enacted to read:
26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36	8. Voluntary return to service. If the beneficiary of a disability retirement benefit decides that he is no longer incapacitated and is able to perform the duties of his employment position, the employer for whom he last worked prior to becoming disabled shall reinstate the person to the first available position for which the beneficiary is gualified and is consistent with the beneficiary's prior work experience. If a collective bargaining agreement applies to such a position, the employer may offer only a position which the beneficiary could claim by virtue of

1 the senicrity accumulated at the time of the disabil-2 ity.

3 In the event there is a dispute between the benefi-4 ciary and the former employer over the beneficiary's 5 mental or physical capacity to perform a specific job, at the option of the beneficiary that dispute 6 7 shall be resolved by the majority decision of 3 phy-8 sicians, one appointed and reimbursed by the beneficiary, one appointed and reimbursed by the employer 9 10 and one appointed by the executive director and reimbursed by the Maine State Retirement System. 11

12 At the option of the former beneficiary who has re-13 turned to an employment position, the disability re-14 tirement benefit may be terminated as of the end of 15 the first month he is reinstated to a position or may 16 be subject to section 1123.

17 If, during the first 5 years of reinstatement, the former beneficiary again becomes disabled as a result 18 19 of the medical condition for which the initial dis-20 ability retirement allowance was granted and termi-21 nates employment, the Maine State Retirement System 22 shall resume paying the disability retirement benefit 23 payable prior to the reinstatement with all applica-24 ble cost-of-living adjustments. The Maine State Re-25 tirement System may require examinations or tests to determine whether a member's medical condition is the 26 27 same as that for which disability retirement was ini-28 tially granted.

29 This provision shall apply to state employees and 30 teachers and shall not apply to participating local 31 districts.

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This new draft is intended to facilitate rehabil-3 itated Maine State Retirement System beneficiaries to 4 return to work. It requires the beneficiary's prior 5 employer to reinstate the individual to the first available position which the individual is qualified б 7 for and which is consistent with the individual's prior work experience and if there is a collective 8 bargaining agreement, which the individual is enti-9 10 tled to by virtue of seniority at the time of dis-11 ability.

Disputes as to whether a beneficiary is rehabilitated will be decided by a 3-physician panel.

14 If the individual again becomes disabled for the 15 condition for which he originally received a disabil-16 ity pension, the individual's disability pension will 17 be reinstated with all applicable cost-of-living ad-18 justments.

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
