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- 4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 6 Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §8452, first ¶, as enacted by 7 PL 1981, c. 693, §§5 and 8, is amended to read:
- 8 The vocational regions shall be administered by a cooperative board organized as follows. Wherever provisions in this section conflict with language set forth in section 8452-A regarding the administration of Vocational Region 1, the language in section 8452-A shall be controlling.
- 14 Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §8452-A is enacted to read:
- 15 §8452-A. Administration of Vocational Region 1, 16 northern Aroostook County
- The administration of Vocational Region 1, northern Aroostook County, shall be in accordance with this section, notwithstanding any other provisions in this Title.
- 21 <u>1. Duties of cooperative board. The cooperative</u> 22 board shall:
- A. In consultation with the superintendents of the member units, develop a region plan for the delivery of vocational education which is subject to approval by the state board in accordance with section 8306;
  - B. Receive and respond to the vocational budget recommendations of each member administrative unit for the delivery of the vocational education program or programs each unit is authorized to provide under the plan developed pursuant to paragraph A; and
- 34 C. Receive and act on the nominations from the

  36 region's coordinator and as members of the

2. Duties of superintendents. The superintendents of the member school administrative units shall: 2 3 A. Develop a regional plan jointly with the co-4 operative board for the delivery of vocational 5 education; 6 B. Individually develop budgets to fund the vocational education program or programs to be op-7 8 erated by each respective member unit and submit 9 the proposed budget to the cooperative board for 10 review; 11 C. Nominate to the cooperative board names of individuals to serve as the region's coordinator 12 13 and as members of the region's central staff; 14 D. Individually, supervise the program or pro-15 grams delivered in his administrative unit; and E. Utilize a weighted vote, based upon popula-16 17 tion, when the superintendents act as one body. 3. Finances, cost-sharing, appeal, tuition. Cost-sharing appeal tuition payment shall be accord-18 19 20 ing to this subsection. 21 A. Each member administrative unit shall adopt a vocational education budget which shall include: 22 23 (1) The cost of the vocational education program or programs identified in 24 25 region's plan to be delivered by that member 26 administrative unit; and 27 (2) That unit's share of the cost for the operation of the region's central office. 2.8 29 B. Costs to be shared by all member administra-30 tive units of the region shall be in accordance 31 with a cost-sharing plan jointly adopted by the 32 superintendents and the cooperative board. 33 C. A member administrative unit or the coopera-34 tive board may appeal to the commissioner the

of program or programs in the latter unit if it

sets forth a claim that the budget is insufficient to meet the cost of operating the identified program or programs and that there will be an irreparable, negative impact on the delivery of that program or programs in the region. Any cost-sharing plan adopted pursuant to paragraph B may also be appealed to the commissioner by a member administrative unit. The commissioner shall conduct an investigation and hold an informal hearing, if he deems it to be necessary, and issue a written decision which shall include findings of fact. The commissioner's decision shall be final and binding.

- D. A member administrative unit shall pay tuition to the unit where the program is offered at a rate not to exceed 150% of the State's secondary school tuition rate; the tuition shall be prorated if the student is there part time.
- 4. Location of program or programs and school construction projects. Location of program or programs and school construction projects shall be according to this subsection.
  - A. The region plan for the delivery of vocational program or programs within the region shall be organized around a decentralized format and shall be physically located, where possible, in school buildings owned or operated by member administrative units.
  - B. Where refurbishing, reconstruction or new construction is needed to meet the goals and objectives of the region, that construction shall be linked to existing secondary school buildings where possible, by either retrofitting existing buildings, constructing additions to existing buildings or building new facilities within the same general geographic setting as existing secondary schools. The site of a school construction project may be located in a different geographic setting if the unit's school board determines that a separate setting best meets the needs of the vocational education program or programs, or if there is inadequate space available at the site where the secondary school is lo-

cated. All school construction projects for vocational education in a member school administrative unit shall be considered a school construction project solely of that administrative unit and not a project of the total region.

- 5. Transportation. Each member administrative unit shall be responsible for providing the transportation needed to transport its students to the site or sites where the program or programs are being delivered.
- 6. Teacher employment and other duties of member administrative units. Teacher employment and other duties of member administrative units shall be according to this subsection.
  - A. The member school administrative units which house the region's vocational program or programs shall be considered the employing unit of all teachers and other staff members necessary for the delivery of the program or programs in that unit. Teachers and other employees shall be governed by the collective bargaining agreements of that member unit; except that, if any of their salaries as of July 1, 1986, exceed the salaries of comparable teachers or other employees in the same unit, they shall not suffer any decrease in pay, but shall remain at existing salary levels until the member unit's bargaining package either meets or exceeds their salaries.
  - B. The member administrative unit shall exercise the same authority over the delivery of the vocational program in that unit which it exercises over the rest of its educational program, except that the vocational curriculum included in the regional plan for the delivery of vocational education shall be established in conjunction with the cooperative board and the superintendents. The vocational budget shall be prepared by the cooperative board and the superintendents pursuant to subsections 1 and 2. The school board of a member administrative unit where a vocational program will be offered must give it final approval for any program being offered in that unit.

7. Vocational Region 1 property. The region shall retain, lease or make such other arrangements as necessary to have only such equipment as is needed to operate the central office, which shall be located within available space in one of the buildings being utilized for the delivery of vocational education, if possible. All other assets, including buses, machinery, tools and materials of any nature shall be tributed among the member administrative units in accordance with a plan to be developed by the superintendents. The region shall retain ownership of any donated property which cannot be distributed to one of the member administrative units because of conditions attached to the donation. In developing a plan for the distribution of assets, the superintendent shall give priority to the need for equipment, tools and other materials needed for specific vocational program or programs, but shall otherwise attempt distribute the assets in an equitable manner which reflects 1984-85 cost-sharing arrangement within the region. The superintendent shall adopt the plan on a weighted vote basis. If the superintendents cannot adopt a plan prior to July 1, 1986, the commissioner shall prepare a plan for the distribution of assets. The plan adopted either by the superintendents or the commissioner shall be final and binding.

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Priority consideration to school Sec. 3. struction projects in certain regions. The State Board of Education is to give priority consideration to school construction projects in any vocational region or center which has not had a school construction project approved by the board, provided that the region or center has developed a 5-year plan for school construction needs and the plan has been approved by the state board. The state board grant approval on a priority basis over a 5-year period ending August 1, 1991, for different phases of the school construction needs identified in the region or center's 5-year plan.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved, except that transition from the existing delivery of vocational education in Vocational Region 1 to the method set forth in this Act shall not occur until July 1, 1986, except for the election of a new
