### §583-A. Motorcycle driver education

Effective March 1, 1987, notwithstanding any other provisions of law, no motorcycle or motor driven cycle learner's permit or permission or restriction to operate a motorcycle or motor driven cycle may be issued to any person under 21 years of age, unless that person presents a certificate of successful completion of a motorcycle driver education course and examination given by the public secondary schools and academies receiving tuition students as described Title 20-A, section 2951, or by a person or persons licensed by the Department of Business, Occupational and Professional Regulation; the course to include a demonstration of ability to safely operate a motorcy-cle. No license may be required of certified teachers conducting a motorcycle driver education course in public secondary schools or academies receiving tuition students as described in Title 20-A, section 2951. All licenses expire on December 31st of the year of issue.

Any person between the ages of 16 and 21 years, who satisfies the Secretary of State that no readily available means of transportation exists to and from a secondary school or academy which he is attending, may be issued, upon passing the motorcycle or motor driven cycle driver's examination as provided in section 581, a special motorcycle or motor driven cycle permit authorizing that person to drive to and from the school or academy.

## 30 §583+B. Motorcycle driver education program

The prescribed motorcycle or motor driven cycle driver education program shall consist of an 8-hour block of instruction directly related to the actual operation of motorcycles and motor driven cycles, emphasizing safety measures designed to insure greater awareness of careful and skillful operation of cycles.

#### §583-C. Instructions

No person may conduct a motorcycle driver education course unless that person has been certified by the Secretary of State as a qualified instructor.

The Secretary of State shall be responsible for 1 conducting certification courses for instructors of 2 3 motorcycle driver education. By rule, the Secretary 4 of State shall establish reasonable qualification 5 standards and requirements for certification of instructors of motorcycle driver education.

8 Each certified instructor shall issue to students 9 who have successfully completed the prescribed motor-10 cycle driver education course a completion certifi-11 cate. When applying for a motorcycle or a motor driven cycle learner's permit, the applicant who has suc-13 cessfully completed the motorcycle driver education course may present the completion certificate to the 14 Secretary of State who may then waive the required 15 16 written examination to qualify for a motorcycle in-17 struction permit.

# §583-E. Instructor availability

When an authorized instructor is not available to teach an approved motorcycle driver education program in a given geographic area of the State, the Secretary of State may assign a qualified instructor who shall be responsible for conducting the instructional program, provided that the requesting authority insures a minimum class size of 6 students wishing to complete the motorcycle driver education program. The Secretary of State shall charge a course fee comparable to other motorcycle driver education courses.

#### §583-F. Suspension and revocation

30 The Secretary of State may suspend, revoke or de-31 ny any certificate of completion of the motorcycle 32 driver education program for just cause.

26	FISCAL NOTE	

This new draft requires a \$89,283 Highway Fund allocation in fiscal year 1987 for 2 driver license examiners and related costs.

The \$2 increase in motorcycle registration will increase Highway Fund revenues by approximately \$96,000.

- In an effort to rework L.D. 1865, the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation appointed a sub-committee on motorcycle driver education. The committee identified several features of a driver education program for motorcycles that it considered important.
- 7 It should be a statewide program.
- 8 The program should be easy to administer.
- The program should make maximum use of existing educational resources, including driver education programs within the schools and private driving schools.
- Incentives should be offered to encourage more first-time operators of motorcycles to complete a motorcycle driver education program.
- Based upon these objectives, the committee concluded that a new and strengthened motorcycle driver education program incorporate the following changes which are reflected in the new draft:
- 20 1. That the motorcycle driver education course 21 time be increased from 2 hours to 8 hours, with 4 22 hours of classroom instruction and 4 hours of range 23 operation;
- 24 2. That for persons successfully completing the 25 new driver education course, the requirement to take 26 the permit test from the Secretary of State will be 27 waived;
- 3. That first-time operators under the age of 21 years be required to successfully complete the new driver education course before obtaining a permit; and
- 32 4. That 2 driver license examiners be hired 33 within the Motor Vehicle Division to administer and 34 coordinate the program.

It is estimated that the cost of this proposal for a revised motorcycle driver education program is approximately \$96,000. Raising the motorcycle registration fee from the present rate of \$15 to \$17 will generate enough revenue to pay for the increased costs.
