18 19 20 21	AN ACT Extending the Boundaries of the Gray Water District to Include the Entire Town.
22 23	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
24 25	Sec. 1. P&SL 1929, c. 33, §1 is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34	Sec. 1. Territorial limits; corporate name; pur- poses. Subject to section 13 hereof, the Town of Gray and the people therein shall constitute a public municipal corporation under the name of "Gray Water District" for the purpose of supplying the Town of Gray, and the inhabitants of the town and the village corporations therein located, with pure water for do- mestic, manufacturing, sanitary and municipal pur- poses.

1 Sec. 2. Referendum; effective date. This Act 2 shall be submitted to the legal voters of the Town of 3 Gray at the next general election in November follow-4 ing passage of this Act. Warrants shall be issued 5 for this town meeting in the manner now provided by 6 law for the holding of town meetings, notifying the 7 qualified voters of Gray to meet to vote on the ap-8 proval or rejection of this Act.

9 The town clerk shall prepare the required bal-10 lots, on which he shall reduce the subject matter of 11 this Act to the following question:

12 "Shall the boundaries of the Gray Water District 13 be extended to include the entire town?"

14 The voters shall indicate by a cross or check 15 mark placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their 16 opinion of the question.

17 The results of the vote shall be declared by the 18 municipal officers of that town and due certificate 19 thereof shall be filed by the town clerk with the 20 Secretary of State.

21 This Act shall be deemed approved by the Town of 22 Gray upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters of that town voting at that election, provided 23 24 that the total number of votes cast for and against 25 the acceptance of this Act in that town at that election equals or exceeds 20% of the total vote for all 26 27 candidates for Governor in that town at the next pre-28 vious gubernatorial election.

29 This Act shall take effect upon its approval by a 30 majority of the legal voters of the Town of Gray vot-31 ing at that election.

STATEMENT OF FACT

33 The purpose of this bill is to extend the bounda-34 ries of the Gray Water District to encompass the en-35 tire Town of Gray.

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
