	Resolve, to Establish a Maine Commission to Examine Chemical Testing of Employees.
	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
	Whereas, there is considerable evidence of substance abuse in the society-at-large and in the workplace; and
	Whereas, substance abuse may increase the risk of serious injury on the job for the employee and coworkers; and
	Whereas, various employers have initiated or intend to initiate programs to test employees for the presence of alcohol or drugs in their bodies; and

1 Whereas, the testing raises serious issues of 2 concern for the privacy rights of individuals; and

 Whereas, questions exist regarding the accuracy of that testing; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Examine Chemical Testing of Employees is established, consisting of 10 members, 5 members to be appointed by the President of the Senate and 5 members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and be it further

Resolved: That the commission will examine the issues involved in testing of employees for the use of alcohol and controlled substances, including the intrusion upon the privacy interests of employees; the safety of the employee and coworkers; the impact of the use of alcohol and controlled substances upon the physical and emotional health of the employee; the accuracy and effectiveness of urinalysis, blood analysis and other methods of testing; and the standards appropriate for determining the existence of impairment; and be it further

Resolved: That the commission meet as necessary to study the issues through examination of data from Maine and other states, to consult with recognized experts, to conduct public hearings and to prepare a report which shall be submitted, together with any accompanying legislation, no later than December 31, 1986, to the First Regular Session of the 113th Legislature; and be it further

Resolved: That the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis, the Department of Human Services, the Department of Labor and the Department of the Attorney General shall provide the commission with sufficient staff assistance and pertinent existing information to carry out these duties; and be it further

1 2 3 4 5	Resolved: That the legislative members of the commission shall receive a per diem compensation and all members shall receive compensation for travel and other necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties; and be it further
6 7 8	Resolved: That the sum of \$5,000 be appropriated to the legislative account to carry out the purpose of this resolve.
9 10 11	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
