ers of the County of Washington are authorized to raise and expend, by issuing bonds or notes, an additional sum not exceeding \$700,000 to make renovations and additions to the Washington County jail; and be it further

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- Sec. 2. Aid from other sources. Resolved: That the county commissioners of Washington County are authorized to borrow any portion of the sums authorized in this Part from or through any agency or department of the State and of the Federal Government. The county commissioners are authorized to receive grants of money and other assistance from or through any agency or department of the State and of the Federal Government for any of the purposes authorized in this Part; and be it further
 - Sec. 3. Bonds. Resolved: That to provide funds for the renovations and additions to the jail, the treasurer of Washington County, with the approval of the county commissioners, may borrow from time to time upon the full faith and credit of the county such sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$700,000 as may be necessary and may issue self-liquidating bonds therefor which shall bear on their face the words "Washington County Capital Improvement Bonds Act of 1986." Each authorized issue shall be payable in such annual installments, beginning not more than 2 years from the date thereof and not earlier than the year 1988, as will extinguish each loan in not more than 20 years from its date. The bonds shall be signed by the treasurer of the county and countersigned by the chairman of the county commissioners. The bonds shall be valid without first obtaining the consent of the county, as provided in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, sections 302 and 404. county may sell these securities at public or private sale upon such terms and conditions as the county commissioners may deem proper, but at not less than par and accrued interest; and be it further
 - Sec. 4. Temporary notes. Resolved: That the county treasurer, with the approval of the county commissioners, may issue temporary notes of the county, payable in not more than one year from their dates, in anticipation of the issue of bonds under this Part and may renew the same, but the time within

- which these bonds shall become due and payable shall not, by reason of these temporary notes, be extended beyond the term fixed by this Part. Any notes issued in anticipation of the bonds shall be paid from the proceeds of the bonds; and be it further
 - Sec. 5. Issuance and expenditure. Resolved: That if any bonds have not been issued within 5 years of the effective date of this resolve, those bonds shall not be issued. If any proceeds from the sale of the bonds have not been expended within 10 years after the date of sale, those proceeds shall lapse to the county's debt service account; and be it further
- Sec. 6. No referendum required. Resolved:
 14 That, notwith anding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, sections 302 and 404, this Part shall become valid upon enactment without being submitted to the voters of Washington County.
- 18 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited 19 in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when 20 approved.

21 STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this resolve is for the laying of the county taxes, authorizing expenditures of Washington County for the year 1986, and authorizing the county to raise \$700,000 for jail renovation.

The funds for the jail renovation are needed to supplement funds previously raised. In 1984 the oters of Washington County by well over a 2-to-1 maigin approved the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$1,400,000 to finance the renovation and addition to the county jail. The bids received by the county for performance of the work on the jail are \$700,000 in excess of the authorized bond issue.

This is an emergency situation because:

The additional space to be provided by this
 construction is badly needed;

- 1 2. The bids received on this construction must 2 be responded to within 60 days; and
- 3. Interest rates available on bonds are cur-4 rently very attractive and it is not known how long 5 such rates will be available.

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
