30 31 32 33	The authority to adjudicate the commission of traffic infractions, as defined by section 1, subsection 17-C, is transferred from the District Court to the Secretary of State effective January 1, 1988.

## sec. 2202. Administrative adjudication of traffic infractions

Effective January 1, 1988, all traffic infractions, as defined by section 1, subsection 17-C, shall be heard and determined administratively by the Secretary of State.

The Secretary of State, with the advice of the Administrative Office of the Court, shall develop and submit to the First Regular Session of the 113th Legislature legislation detailing the implementation of the transfer of authority as provided in section 2201.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this new draft is to provide for a complete transfer of authority to adjudicate traffic infractions from the District Court to the Secretary of State by January 1, 1988, rather than the 2-step approach provided in Parts A and B of the original bill. This new draft requires that legislation be submitted to the 113th Legislature detailing the implementation of the transfer of this authority.
