AN ACT Creating a Moratorium on Further Approval for Landfills for Out-of-state Waste.
Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
Whereas, the long-term effects of landfills or the environment have not been adequately assessed and identified; and
Whereas, a study of these effects and the potential effects of future landfills is immediately necessary; and
Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
 - Sec. 1. Legislative study. The Joint Standing Committee on Energy and Natural Resources shall study the current and potential effects of existing landfills on the environment, including the effects on underground water supplies. The study shall also study the possible impact any additional landfills may have on the environment. The committee shall submit its report, together with any necessary legislation, to the First Regular Session of the 113th Legislature no later than January 1, 1987.
- 13 Notwithstanding the Sec. 2. Moratorium. 14 Revised Statutes, Title 38, sections 344 and 1304 or any other provision of law, no license or permit for 15 16 any landfill which will receive imported waste materials may be issued after the effective date of this 17 Act until January 1, 1987 or until the report 18 19 quired in section 1 is submitted to the Legislature, 20 whichever is later.
- Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
- 24 STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill provides for a study of environmental effects of landfills and further provides that no new landfills which will receive out-of-state waste materials may be authorized until such study is completed.

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
