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5 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

7 PART A

- Sec. 1. Appropriation from the General Fund. There is appropriated from the General Fund to a special compensation account the sum of \$4,100,634 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1987, to implement the economic terms agreed to by the State and the Maine State Employees Association for the Administrative Services Bargaining Unit; Supervisory Services Bargaining Unit; Professional and Technical Services Bargaining Unit; Law Enforcement Services Bargaining Unit; and the Operations, Maintenance and Support Services Bargaining Unit.
- Sec. 2. Allocations from the Highway Fund. There is allocated from the Highway Fund to a special compensation account the sum of \$2,426,292 to fund salary and benefit changes for state employees represented by the Maine State Employees Association for the Administrative Services Bargaining Unit; Supervisory Services Bargaining Unit; Professional and Technical Services Bargaining Unit; Law Enforcement Services Bargaining Unit; and the Operations, Maintenance and Support Services Bargaining Unit.
- Sec. 3. Special account funding. Funding provided by this Act shall be segregated into accounts to be made available as needed upon the recommendation of the State Budget Officer, with the apthe Governor. Except for funds appropriproval of ated and allocated to implement a section include retirement costs. Positions supported from sources of funding other than the General and Highway Fund shall be funded whenever possible from those other sources.
- Sec. 4. Lump sum payment. A lump sum payment equal to 4% of the employee's gross pay from the be-

Any employee in tirement the bargaining units listed above who retires within 13 years of July 1, 1986, may pay to the Maine State 14 15 Retirement System the amount of the employer's the employee's contributions established by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, sections 1062 and 1095, 16 17 which would be payable on the 4% sum if it were earn-18 19 able compensation. Upon payment of these amounts, in 20 accordance with the rules established by the board of 21 trustees, the employee shall be entitled to consideration of the 4% sum for purposes of average final 22 23 compensation.

Sec. 5. Adjustment of salary schedule for fiscal year 1986-87. Effective at the beginning of the pay week commencing closest to January 1, 1987, the salary schedule for employees in the Administrative Services Bargaining Unit; Supervisory Services Bargaining Unit; Professional and Technical Services Bargaining Unit; Law Enforcement Services Bargaining Unit; and the Operations, Maintenance and Support Services Bargaining Unit, shall be adjusted by 4% consistent with the terms of the collective bargaining contract.

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Sec. 6. New employees, similar and equitable treatment. Employees in classifications included in the Administrative Services Bargaining Unit; Supervisory Services Bargaining Unit; Professional and Technical Services Bargaining Unit; Law Enforcement Services Bargaining Unit; and the Operations, Maintenance and Support Services Bargaining Unit, but who are excluded from collective bargaining pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, section 979-A, subsection 6, paragraphs E and F, shall be given similar and equitable treatment on a pro rata basis to

that given employees covered by the contract, except 1 2 that nonstatus employees in acting capacity, 3 mittent or project positions shall not receive any 4 lump sum payment provided in section 4. 5 PART B 6 Authorization for reimbursement of costs associ-7 ated with contract resolution.
