IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SIX
AN ACT Amending the Community Industrial Buildings Program Law.
Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
Whereas, the Community Industrial Buildings (CIB) Program contains a restriction that prohibits the construction of CIB buildings in a county with an unoccupied CIB building; and
Whereas, county lines are not realistic boundaries of different economies; and
Whereas, the municipalities bear the responsibility for the repayment of these industrial buildings which takes the burden off the State; and

Whereas, there are several municipalities which could realize significant economic results very soon if the restriction is removed; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore.

- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- C. No more than one unoccupied community industrial building may be financed in any one labor market area as defined by the Maine Department of Labor.

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2 This bill amends the Community Industrial Buildings Program (CIB) which provides "shell" building 3 financing for the construction of "shell" industrial 4 5 buildings or speculation buildings in municipalities 6 which need these facilities to bring industry into the municipalities or enable an existing business 7 8 expand. Currently the law prohibits the construction 9 of a "shell" building in a county in which there is an existing unoccupied shell building. 10 As a if there is an unoccupied shell building in Houlton, 11 12 a shell building cannot be constructed in Madawaska 13 the CIB program no matter how significant the under potential results could be. Similarly, an industrial 14 15 building could not be constructed in Wilton under the 16 CIB program if there is an unoccupied CIB building in 17 Rangeley.

County lines are not accurate or real boundaries of different economies in the State. The Dexter economy is very different for the Bangor economy which, in turn, is very different from the Lincoln economy, all of which are located in the same county.

This bill proposes to use labor market areas as defined by the Department of Labor as geographical boundaries of economies throughout the State. In this way, a distressed municipality will not be penalized by the existence of an unoccupied CIB building in another municipality.

This bill is necessary to remove an unnecessary restriction that severely and adversely affects the economies of many different municipalities in rural areas.

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
