	23 24	Whereas, current statutes do not provide for immediate and effective law enforcement; and
	25 26	Whereas, the current description of the prohibited area is incorrect; and
	27 28	Whereas, the clear intent of the law is being violated by repeated dragging in cable areas; and
	29 30 31 32	Whereas, the health and safety of island residents is placed in jeopardy by the repeated dragging in cable areas in the face of the unenforceability of the statutes; and

- Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
- 7 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 9 Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6402-A; as enacted by PL 1983, 10 c. 179, §1, is amended to read:
- 11 §6402-A. Suspension based on conviction of dragging in cable area
- For any person convicted in court of violating section 6954 or 6954-A, the commissioner shall suspend the license authorizing the activity in which the person was engaged at the time of the violation. The suspension shall be for one year from the date of the conviction.
- Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6954, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 179, §3, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
- 22 2. Penalty. A violation of this section is a 23 Class D crime, except that the minimum fine shall be 24 \$500 and may not be suspended.
- Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §6954-A, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 317, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
- 28 §6954-A. Dragging and scalloping prohibited in the 29 Frenchboro area
- 30 1. Violation. It is unlawful to take scallops by any means or to operate any watercraft when towing 31 drag or trawl within the following area: Starting 32 33 at the easternmost point on Red Point, Swan's Island; 34 thence in an easterly direction to the southernmost point of the western Sister's Island; thence in a 35 36 southeasterly direction to the southernmost point of 37 Crow Island; thence in a southerly direction to the

2 .	Island; thence southerly to the state ferry terminal
3	located on the eastern side of Lunt's Harbor,

2. Penalty. A violation of this section is a Class D crime, except that the minimum fine shall be \$500 and may not be suspended.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

## 18 STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to make technical corrections in the description of the cable area between Swan's Island and Frenchboro, Long Island which was closed by the Legislature in 1985 to all forms of dragging. The bill also changes the penalty provisions from civil to criminal. The procedures for pursuing a civil violation are much slower than the criminal procedures. The civil procedures thus preclude timely enforcement of the dragging prohibition. Therefore, the change from a civil to criminal penalty aids the Department of Marine Resources in its effort to protect the health and safety of Frenchboro residents.

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
