Brennan.' 12 Further amend the bill by striking out everything 13 after the title and inserting in its place the fol-14 lowing: 15 'Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 16 follows: 17 Sec. 1. 2 MRSA §1, as amended by PL 1985, c. 18 693, §1, is further amended to read: 19 §1. Residence; office hours; secretary; salary 20 The Governor shall have his official residence at 21 Augusta during his term of office, and shall keep his 22 office at the State House open for the transaction of 23 the business of the State during all normal working 24 hours of the State House. 25 In the absence of the Governor, his private sec-26 retary shall be in attendance and the private secre-27 tary shall devote his entire time to the duties of 28 his office. 29 Until the first Wednesday of January 1987, the 30 Governor shall receive an annual salary of \$35,000. 31 Beginning the first Wednesday of January 1987, the 32 Governor shall receive an annual salary of \$70,000. 33 The annual salary of the Governor shall be re-

1 2	viewed in the 3rd year of each gubernatorial term in office by the State Compensation Commission.
3 4 5	A former Governor may accept as a personal gift from the State at the end of his final term the desk and chair used by that Governor as Governor.
6 7 8	Sec. 2. Application. This provision shall apply to former Governor Joseph E. Brennan and all his successors.'
9	STATEMENT OF FACT
10 11 12	This amendment creates a law authorizing the gift of a Governor's desk and chair to him at the end of his final term.
