Sec. 2. 29 MRSA §891, 7th ¶, as amended by PL 1979, c. 480, §3, is further amended to read:

The driver of any vehicle involved in an accident resulting in injury to or death of any person or property damage to the apparent amount of \$300 \$1,000 or more, or some person acting for him, shall, within 48 hours after the accident, make a written report of it to the Secretary of State, on forms provided by seid the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State may require drivers of vehicles involved in any such accident to file supplemental reports whenever the original report is insufficient in the opinion of the Secretary of State.

31 STATEMENT OF FACT

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The purpose of this bill is to increase the minimum property damage amount over which a motor vehicle accident must be filed from \$300 to \$1,000.

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
