25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33	The municipal officers of cities and towns and the assessors of plantations, upon receipt of a petition signed by at least 15% of the voters, voting in that municipality in the last gubernatorial election and addressed to the municipal officers, as defined in Title 30, Section 1901, subsection 7, at least 250 days prior to holding any primary, special statewide, general or municipal election or annual or special town meeting, are empowered and directed to no-

1	tify the inhabitants of their respective municipali-
2	ties to meet, in the manner prescribed by law to vote
3	upon any or all of the following questions: All peti-
4	tion signatures must have been signed since the last
5	general election.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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7 The purpose of this bill is to provide municipal officers adequate time to prepare ballots for local liquor option questions.

The bill changes the number of days by which the municipal officers or plantation assessors must give notice concerning local liquor option questions from 21 to 60 days prior to an election.

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
