Amend the Bill in section 1, in subsection 4, in  
the 10th line (page 2, line 31 in L.D.) by striking  
out the underlined words "State or subdivisions of  
the State" and inserting in their place the follow-  
ing: 'Office of Employment Rehabilitation'

Further amend the Bill in section 1, subsection  
4, by inserting at the end the following:

'This subsection does not prevent any employee or his  
employer from obtaining or viewing information relat-  
ing to the rehabilitation of that employee under this

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment is intended to clarify the scope  
of the confidentiality of records of the Office of  
Employment Rehabilitation in the Workers' Compensa-  
tion Commission. The amendment clarifies that only  
those rehabilitation records that are located in the  
Office of Employment Rehabilitation are confidential.  
The amendment also clarifies that an employee, his  
employer or his employer's insurance carrier may gain  
access to the records relating to the rehabilitation  
of that employee.
