STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to clarify the status of the Maine Veterans' Homes as a governmental entity within the meaning of the Maine Tort Claims Act so that the homes will enjoy the same benefits with respect to tort immunity as other state agencies and instrumentalities. In addition, the bill would provide that other agencies and departments of State Government may provide such assistance, counsel and advice to the Board of Trustees of the Maine Veterans' Homes when requested by the board in the discharge of its duties.

This bill is necessary at this time following the issuance of a memorandum of counsel from the Attorney General's Office to the administrator of the home in which it was concluded that there is significant doubt as to the status of the Maine Veterans' Home as a governmental entity under the Maine Tort Claims Act.

Section 1 of the bill amends the definition of the term "State" Title 14, section 8102, subsection 4, the Maine Tort Claims Act, to include the Maine Veterans' Homes so that the homes will be entitled to the same immunity from tort liability, which is available to state agencies, authorities and depart-

1	Section 2 of the bill authorizes the board of
2.	trustees of the homes to call upon departments and
3	agencies of the State to provide such assistance and
4	counsel and advice as the board may be in need of in
5	the discharge of its duties. This would include uti-
6	lizing the services of the Bureau of Purchases, when
7	necessary, the Attorney General's Office, for legal
8	advice and representation, and other agencies and de-
9	partments of the State which may be in a position to
10	provide assistance to the homes.
